Milan and its Surroundings: Between Heritage and Innovation

4 nights

Day 1 – Milan, the Historic Centre

Arrival in Italy and first discovery of the historic centre of Milan: the majestic Piazza del Duomo, the city's heart, dominated by the famous Gothic Cathedral (with entry); the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, an elegant 19th-century covered gallery; Via and Piazza Mercanti, and the Teatro alla Scala Museum, the global temple of opera. Lunch in a restaurant during the visit. Check-in at the hotel, dinner in a restaurant, and overnight stay.

Day 2 – Milan, the Modern City

After breakfast, continue exploring Milan with a visit to the Cimitero Monumentale (Monumental Cemetery), a true open-air museum thanks to its spectacular tombs and sculptures by great artists. Continuation to the modern districts of Porta Nuova and Isola, dominated by glass skyscrapers and the famous "Bosco Verticale" (Vertical Forest) by Stefano Boeri, symbols of the city's green and innovative architecture. Then, stroll along Corso Como, an elegant boulevard bustling with trendy cafes, restaurants, and boutiques. Return to the hotel, dinner in a restaurant, and overnight stay.



Day 3 – Monza and Free Afternoon in Milan

Breakfast and departure for Monza, a charming Lombard city. Guided tour of the city and the Villa Reale (Royal Villa), a former royal residence with its magnificent gardens and elegant interiors. Lunch in a restaurant and return to Milan. In the afternoon, free time for individual discoveries: possibility to visit the Cenacolo Vinciano (The Last Supper), the San Siro Stadium, or the Pinacoteca di Brera or one of the city's other famous museums. Return to the hotel, dinner in a restaurant, and overnight stay.

Day 4 – Pavia, Certosa di Pavia, and Chiaravalle Abbey

After breakfast, excursion to Pavia, the ancient capital of the Lombard Kingdom. Visit its Certosa (Charterhouse), a Renaissance masterpiece, famous for its sculpted facade and refined cloisters, and continuation to the historic centre. Discovery of its medieval alleys, Piazza della Vittoria, and the Ponte Coperto (Covered Bridge) over the Ticino River. Lunch in a restaurant. On the way back to Milan, stop and visit the Chiaravalle Abbey, a magnificent example of Cistercian architecture, founded in the 12th century, with its cloisters and Gothic church preserved in a peaceful and green setting. Return to Milan, dinner in a restaurant, and overnight stay.

Day 5 – Navigli District and Departure

Breakfast and morning dedicated to discovering the Navigli district, a picturesque canal area with lively alleys, artisan workshops, and charming cafes, one of the most authentic and vibrant neighbourhoods in Milan. Lunch in a typical restaurant and end of our services.
